TO THE PARTIES: AS A CONDITION TO FILING AN ACTION IN THIS COURT, AND, BY ORDER OF THIS COURT, AS ADOPTED BY LOCAL RULE, BOTH PARTIES ARE HEREBY ORDERED TO COMPLY WITH AND OBEY THIS MANDATORY RESTRAINING ORDER, THE TERMS OF WHICH ARE AS FOLLOWS:

- 1.) You shall not intentionally cause physical or other harm to any of the parties to this action nor to any minor children;
- 2.) You shall not remove/relocate any minor children of the parties from Trumbull County, Ohio, or, from their current residence if not currently residing in Trumbull County. Nor shall you change their school or school district;
- 3.) Except as set forth under this order, you shall not hypothecate, sell, transfer, encumber, mortgage, or give away by gift or otherwise dispose of any property accumulated during the marriage, or any other asset subject to the jurisdiction of this court WHICH INCLUDES WITHOUT LIMITATION cash, money in banks, cars and motor vehicles;
- 4.) You may use sufficient assets for your usual and customary living expenses; Note: For purposes of this ORDER and NOTICE, customary living expenses are those expenses typically incurred by the parties to this action for rent, mortgage payments, car payments, utility payments, food, and other regular monthly obligations previously incurred by the parties;
- 5.) You shall not change utilities, or fail to renew the present health, life, home, automobile or other insurance coverage, including health insurance for all currently existing dependents; nor shall you remove the other party as a beneficiary on any life insurance or retirement benefits, without further Order of this Court;
- 6.) You shall obtain prior Court approval, or submit an Agreed Judgment Entry, to file separate income tax returns; and
- 7.) You shall not charge to the credit of your spouse.

Both parties shall obey this Mandatory Restraining Order unless modified by court after hearing. A failure to do so may result in a finding of contempt by the court, punishable in accordance with Ohio law.
